Intervene Early

Do not leave it until the last minute if you are experiencing any difficulty around your child's attendance or behaviour, contact your school as early as possible to avoid habits and behaviours becoming embedded. This could become difficult to put right later on.

PUTTING CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE FIRST

Some schools have the capacity to employ staff directly, alternatively some commission private companies to help them to address the welfare needs of the child and maintain contact with parents whose children are not attending school. Only the Dudley Education Investigation Service have the authority to take legal proceedings against you.

Make sure your child is educated either at a mainstream school, an Academy, a free or independent school, or educated otherwise than at school.

- Work with the school to improve attendance
- Keep talking and meeting with the school.
- Tell them if you have a problem
- Ask for help if you need it

- Be open and honest with you
- Work with you to support your child's attendance
- Address any additional needs that your child may have, or identify agencies to help
- Include you in discussions about his/her education
