Cerebral palsy is an umbrella term for a type of physical disability caused by damage to the brain which occurs before, during, or immediately after, the birth of a child. It is the most common motor disability in childhood and is a lifelong condition.

How Does Cerebral Palsy affect someone?

Each Individual with Cerebral Palsy will be affected differently, and it can vary from mild to severe. For some people, Cerebral Palsy will affect them physically, making movements more difficult. Others may also be affected by seizures, epilepsy or difficulties with speech and language.
