Child Stroke Awareness Day

Childhood Stroke Quick Facts

- Stroke can affect people of any age, including babies in the womb.
- The term childhood stroke covers stroke occurring from the 38th week of pregnancy up to the age of 18.
- Over 400 children will have a stroke each year in the UK.
- A stroke happens when the blood supply to part of the brain is cut off, killing brain cells. Damage to the brain can affect how the body works. It can change how you think and feel.
- Childhood stroke are either caused by a blocked blood vessel in the brain (Ischaemic) or by a bleed in or around the brain (Haemorrhagic).

Spot the signs: do the FAST test

Rebuilding lives after stroke

Stroke
Association

Face

Can the young person smile? Has their face fallen on one side?

Arms

Can they raise both arms and keep them there?

Speech

Can they understand what you say? Is their speech slurred?

Time

If you spot any of these signs in a baby, child or young person, don't wait. Call 999 straight away.

Even if the symptoms seem to pass, you should call 999 as it could be a transient ischaemic attack (TIA or mini-stroke).
